What is an Administrative Record?

An administrative record is a collection of documents that forms the basis for an agency's decision, in this case the selection of a response action.

Under section 113(k) of the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA), 42 U.S.C. § 9613(k), as amended by the Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act, the EPA is required to establish an administrative record for every CERCLA response action and to make a copy of the administrative record available for public review.
